

Afterlife	Christians will be with the Lord in heaven (Phil. 1.21-24), in our resurrected bodies (1 Cor. 15:50-58). Non-Christians will be cast into hell forever (Matt. 25:46).	There is an afterlife (75:12) experienced as either an ideal life of Paradise (29:64), for faithful Muslims or Hell for those who are not.
Angels	Created beings, non-human, some of which, fell into sin and became evil. They are very powerful. The unfallen angels carry out the will of God.	Created beings without free will that serve God. Angels were created from light.
Atonement	The sacrifice of Christ on the cross (1 Pet. 2:24) whereby His blood becomes the sacrifice that turns away the wrath of God (1 John 2:2) from the sinner when the sinner receives (John 1:12), by faith (Rom. 5:1), the work of Christ on the cross.	There is no atonement work in Islam other than a sincere confession of sin and repentance by the sinner.

There is no other God in existence.	God is known as Allah. Allah is one person, a strict unity. There is no other God in existence. Heaven (Paradise)	The place where God dwells. <u>Heaven</u> is the eventual home of the Christians who are saved by God's grace. It is heaven because it is where God is and Christians will enjoy eternal <u>Fellowship</u> with Him.	Paradise to Muslims, a place of unimaginable bliss (32:17), a garden with trees and food (13:35;15:45-48) where the desires of faithful Muslims are met, (3:133; 9:38; 13:35; 39:34; 43:71; 53:13-15).
Hell	A place of torment in fire out of the presence of God. There is no escape from Hell (Matt. 25:46). Holy Spirit	Third person of the Trinity. The <u>Holy Spirit</u> is fully God in nature.	The arch-angel Gabriel who delivered the words of the Koran to Muhammad.

Term	Christianity	Islam

Original Sin	This is a term used to describe the effect of Adam's sin on his descendants (Rom. 5:12-23). Specifically, it is our inheritance of a sinful nature from Adam. All people are sinless until they rebel against God. They do not have sinful natures.

Son of God	A term used to designate that Jesus is divine though he is not the literal son of God in a physical sense (John 5:18).	A literal son of God. Therefore, Jesus cannot be the son of Allah.
Word, The	"In the beginning was the word and the word was with God and the word was Godand the word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:1, 14).	Allah's command of existence which resulted in Jesus being formed in the womb of Mary.

WHAT DO MUSLIMS BELIEVE ABOUT JESUS?



- Isa (Jesus) is mentioned 93 times in the Quran. It describes his virgin birth, calling him the "son of Mary" 23 times.
- Jesus is given more honorific titles in the Quran than any other prophet (including Muhammad.) Those titles include "prophet", "messiah", "messenger", "word", and "spirit and mercy of God."

WHAT DO MUSLIMS THINK OF JESUS?

- The Quran also mentions the miracles of Jesus, refers to "the gospel" 12 times, and calls Christians the "people of the book."
- In addition to the Quran, Muslim traditions associate Jesus with the end of time and the judgment day, and Muslims often pray to Jesus for healing or prosperity. He is considered to one who has power.


WHAT DO MUSLIMS THINK OF JESUS?

- However, there is no other religion like Islam in that from its inception it has promoted a specific, total, and emphatic <u>denial</u> of the major truth claims of Christianity.
- This may partly be because of Muhammad's misunderstandings of the corrupted Christianity of his day, but it may also be explained by Islam's desire to demonstrate that it has superseded all other religions as the last and greatest revelation of Allah.

ISLAM'S ATTACKS ON CHRISTIANITY

- That the Bible of the Christians is corrupt, unreliable, and inferior to the Qur'an.
- That Christians follow untruthful doctrines: the doctrine of the Trinity is especially considered to be blasphemous and sinful.
- That Jesus is <u>not</u> the divine son of God, because God is too exalted to have a son.
- That Jesus was <u>not</u> crucified and was <u>not</u> resurrected; that he is <u>not</u> a savior or mediator and did <u>not</u> atone for the sins of mankind.

WHAT DO MUSLIMS THINK OF JESUS?



"That they said in boast 'We killed Christ Jesus the son of Mary, the Messenger of Allah.' But they killed him not, nor crucified him, but so it was made to appear to them. And those who differ therein are full of doubts, with no certain knowledge, but only conjecture to follow, for of a surety they killed him not. Nay, Allah raised him up unto Himself; and Allah is exalted in Power, Wise." (Qur'an 4:157-

WHAT DO MUSLIMS THINK OF JESUS?




- Some Muslims believe that Jesus hid in a niche in the wall and one of his companions took his place.
- Others hold that angels protected Jesus and caused Judas to look like him instead.
- Other assert that Simon of Cyrene was switched at the last minute.
- Another traditional view is that the Jews attempted to kill Jesus but that God took him up into heaven instead.

- There are more than a billion Muslims (about 1 out of every 5 people on the planet); the U.N. projects that by 2055 at least half of the global birthrate will be Islamic.
- Muslims have targeted the United States with an aggressive missionary program. Saudi Arabia has given millions of dollars to Harvard and the University of Arkansas to fund Islamic study centers.

DID YOU KNOW?



- There are already more Muslims than Episcopalians in America; and, within ten years, Islam may be the second largest religion in the United States.
- Between 1989 and 1998 the Islamic population in this country grew by 25%; there are now estimated to be between 4 and 7 million Muslims in the U.S.



Contrasting Worldviews

Shortly after the end of the Cold War, Samuel Huntington, professor of government at Harvard, predicted that in the future serious competition would lessen between nation-states or political ideologies.

Instead, Huntington predicted an era of growing competition between civilizations: i.e., religion, ethnicity, and cultural values.

ISLAM & CHRISTIANTY: Contrasting Worldviews

- Muhammad put his enemies to the sword and confiscated their property and wives; commanded his followers to fight for their faith; taught that those who died in battle would enter paradise; and died a natural death after consolidating his power and wealth.
- Jesus told his disciples to "put away the sword" (John 18:11); healed the one wound inflicted by his followers (Luke 22:51); allowed his enemies to take his life (1 Peter 2:21-24); and prayed from the cross for those who were executing him (Luke 23:34.)

THE FIVE PILLARS OF ISLAM

- Shahadah: "There is no god but Allah, and Muhammad is his prophet"
- Salah: Turning to Mecca to pray 5 times a day
- Sawm: Fasting during daylight hours through the month of Ramadan
- Zakat: Setting aside 2.5% of income to benefit the Muslim community
- Hajj: A once-in-a-lifetime pilgrimage to Mecca



- Muhammad was given a "special revelation" to have some 13 wives (other Muslim men can have only 4)
- His favorite wife was Aisha: she was six when they were engaged, and nine when the marriage was consummated



- The Koran requires women to remain veiled (33:59) and to remain strictly segregated from male society.
- Woman is to be seen
 "as Satan" when a man
 is sexually tempted.
 One of the traditions of
 Muhammad is that the
 majority of people
 going to hell are
 women.



- A man may divorce his wife by repeating "I divorce you" 3 times.
- In court, a woman's testimony is worth only half that of a man and her inheritance rights are lesser.
- The United Nations has condemned the Taliban in Afghanistan for their brutal treatment of women.




* The Quran teaches:

Who Is Osama Bin-Laden?



We need to avoid two extremes.

- First, we should avoid dealing in stereotypes and prejudices.
 It is true that not all Muslims support the use of terror.
 They are considered liberal.
- But second, it is a mistake to believe that Islam shares the same mindset as Western civilization: it does <u>not</u>. The teachings of Islam foster a very different worldview.

The Muslims repeatedly claim that the Bible has been corrupted and that the Qu'ran is the only trustworthy scripture in existence. This is why Muslims often attack the Bible. But this cannot be acording to the Quran. The Quran says that the books of Moses, the Psalms, and the gospel were all given by God.

- TORAH "We gave Moses the Book and followed him up with a succession of messengers," (Sura 2:87).
- PSALMS "We have sent thee inspiration, as We sent it to Noah and the Messengers after him: we sent inspiration to Abraham, Isma'il, Isaac, Jacob and the Tribes, to Jesus, Job, Jonah, Aaron, and solomon, and to David We gave the Psalms," (4:163).
- GOSPEL "It is He Who sent down to thee (step by step), in truth, the Book, confirming what went before it; and He sent down the Law (of Moses) and the Gospel (of Jesus) before this, as a guide to mankind, and He sent down the criterion (of judgment between right and wrong)," (3:3).

Also, "And in their footsteps We sent Jesus the son of Mary, confirming the Law that had come before him: We sent him the Gospel: therein was guidance and light

We see that the Qu'ran states that the Torah, the Psalms, and the Gospel were all given by God. With this we Christians heartily agree. But, the Muslims claim that the Bible is corrupted and full of contradictions. If that is so, then it would seem they do not believe the Qu'ran since the Qu'ran says that the Word of God cannot be altered:

- "Rejected were the messengers before thee: with patience and constancy they bore their rejection and their wrongs, until Our aid did reach them: there is none that can alter the words (and decrees) of Allah. Already hast thou received some account of those messengers," (6:34).
- "The word of thy Lord doth find its fulfillment in truth and in justice: None can change His words: for He is the one who heareth and knoweth all," (6:115).
- "For them are glad tidings, in the life of the present and in the Hereafter; no change can there be in the words of Allah. This is indeed the supreme felicity," (10:64).

HOW DID ISLAM BEGIN?

- To understand the mindset of fundamentalist Islamic terrorists, it is necessary to comprehend the worldview of Islam.
- We cannot understand that mindset apart from the history of the beginnings of Islam.



UNDERSTANDING ISLAM



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Muhammad was born in Mecca around 570 A.D.

The Arabian peninsula of the sixth century was a tribal society marked by chronic conflict. Many religions were present, including polytheism, animism, Judaism, Zoroastrianism, and Christianity.

- 1. Muhammad married the wealthy widow Khadija, who provided him economic security, became one of his first converts to Islam, and gave him a daughter, Fatima.
- 2. He experienced in a cave visions from Allah through the angel Gabriel which he identified as revelations and later codified into the Qur'an, a perfect book from God.

- 3. Muhammad preached monotheism and attacked the polytheism and animism of tribal worship at the kaba in the center of Mecca, resulting in notoriety and persecution.
- 4. He won as a convert Ali, who later married Muhammad's daughter Fatima, fathering two sons, Hasan and Husain, and becoming the first imam of the Shiites.

- 5. Muhammad escaped to Medina in 622
 A.D., an event known as the *Hegira*; the Hegira begins the Islamic calendar.
- 6. There he established the umma, the community of Islam; built the first mosque; organized an army; and played the roles of prophet, ruler, judge, commander-in-chief, and prayer leader.

- To Muhammad set out on a conquest of the Arabian peninsula, subduing the tribes (including Jewish tribes), killing thousands, collecting booty (including concubines), and consolidating his power.
- 8. He gained many wives and concubines, his favorite being Aisha, with whom he consummated marriage when she was nine years old.

- 9. When Muhammad gained control of Mecca in 630 A.D. he purged the kaba of idols and established it as the place of pilgrimage to worship Allah.
- 10. Muhammad died and was buried in 632 A.D., leaving behind no official successor.



HIS VISIONS IN THE CAVE: THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE KORAN

- Muhammad had admired the Jews and Christians because they were the "People of the Book."
- By contrast, his own divided, warring, idolatrous people had no "book" of their own.



The QUR'AN



- Muhammad thought the Jews and Christians would be impressed with his book, but they were not. His own countrymen initially accused him of disseminating Christian & Jewish information.
- It would be difficult to over-exaggerate the importance of the Qur'an to Islam today. To Muslims it is the incarnate Word of God in Arabic.

The *Hadith* (Traditions)

The sunnah (what the Prophet Muhammad said, did, or approved of) is the second source of authority in Islam. The sunnah is comprised of hadeeths, which are reliably transmitted reports by the Prophet's companions of what he said, did, or approved of.

They are closely studied today and are considered to be authoritative guides to life in Muslim culture.

THE FLIGHT TO MEDINA: THE HEGIRA

❖ July 16, 622 A.D. is the decisive event in Islamic history. The Meccans were on the verge of killing Muhammad when delegates from the various tribes of Medina came to Muhammad to request his leadership and pledged to fight for him.



Medina, 200 miles to the north, provided Muhammad with a power base from which to establish the first Islamic community.



Consolidating Power in Medina

- Medina was inhabited by warring Arab and Jewish tribes.
- To appease the Jews, Muhammad proposed Friday as the Sabbath and praying to Jerusalem 5 times a day. When they refused, he chose to pray facing Mecca.
- Muhammad adopted Abraham as patriarch through the lineage of Ishmael.

Consolidating Power in Medina

- Muhammad engaged in numerous battles and the Jewish tribes were expelled or executed. In a battle with the last Jewish tribe around Medina, 700 to 800 men were slaughtered and their wives and children taken as booty.
- Muhammad later married a Jewish widow and continued to have a high regard for Jewish monotheism and the "People of the Book."

THE CONQUEST OF THE PENINSULA

- The rapid spread of Muhammad's power throughout the Middle East is an amazing story.
- ❖ Why was he able to conquer such a large area? Dr. Evertt Huffard suggests five factors:



- 1. IT FILLED A MORAL & POLITICAL VACUUM IN THE SEVENTH CENTURY.
- The "superpowers" of the day, the Byzantine and Persian empires, had become corrupt and soon collapsed.
- Islam was able to fill the void.



- 2. ISLAM CLAIMED A
 UNIVERSAL
 ALLEGIANCE TO AN
 ALMIGHTY GOD.
- It was a contrast to the idolatry of Arabia and the icons of the Eastern church.
- The God of Islam is preeminently a God of "power."



- 3. IT OFFERED A SIMPLE RELIGION.
- The traditions of Judaism and the Eastern Orthodox church had become complex and cumbersome.
- Islam asked only that its adherents accept the "5 Pillars."
- It promoted a firm monotheism and a strict moral code.



- 4. IT CREATED A
 POWERFUL, ALLENCOMPASSING
 THEOCRACY.
- Arab armies employed the sword against their enemies, political or religious.
- For example, only 21 of 59 Greek Orthodox patriarchs died a natural death from the 15th to the 20th century.



- 5. THERE WERE
 CULTURAL AND
 FINANCIAL BENEFITS
 TO ISLAM.
- Conversion brought relief from minority taxes.
- Arabs were slave traders: Africans who converted were less likely to be sold.
- Muhammad received 1/5th of the spoils of war; his fighters received 4/5ths.



The Concept of Jihad

- Since Islam was a militant faith from the beginning, it was natural for Muhammad to teach the doctrine of *jihad*.
- The word means "struggle"; while it is often used in a spiritual sense to apply to the inner struggle of every believer, it also means a "holy war" in defense of the Islamic faith.

The Significance of the Life of Muhammad: A Deeper Look

THE DEATH OF MUHAMMAD AND THE STRUGGLE FOR POWER

During his lifetime Muhammad had established a "theocracy" with himself as the head.

He did not, however, provide for an orderly succession of power, an oversight which has had political and religious repercussions to this day.



AFTER HIS DEATH, ISLAM SPLIT INTO FACTIONS

SUNNI

One faction held the successor to Muhammad should be a male from the Quraish tribe, chosen by consensus.

Abu Bakr, an early convert, was chosen as the first "caliph" (or "leader")

SHI'ITE

Another faction believed that Muhammad intended for Ali, his son-in-law, to take over.

These partisans (or Shi'ites) of Ali regarded him as the first caliph and imam.

AFTER HIS DEATH, ISLAM SPLIT INTO FACTIONS

SUNNI

The early period of the caliphs was the "golden age" of Islamic conquest.

The caliphs subjugated
Damascus, Iraq,
Jerusalem, Egypt, and
Persia.

90% of all Muslims today are Sunni. Bin-Ladin's stated goal is to restore the age of the caliphs.

SHI'ITE

The two sons of Ali, Hasan and Husain, are regarded by Shi'ites as the second and third imams. Ali, Hasan, and Husain were all murdered by Sunni opponents.

Shi'ites believe the 12th imam will one day return as *Mahdi*. In the meantime, they recognize the authority of the *ayatollah*. Iran is the leading Shi'ite nation.



ISLAM & CHRISTIANTY: Contrasting Worldviews

- Islam began with a brief period of persecution and quickly became powerful.
- Muhammad claimed to be a prophet of the one true God.
- Muhammad amassed political power and created an earthly kingdom.

- Christianity began as a persecuted minority and flourished in spite of continued persecution.
- Jesus claimed to be the Son of the one true God.
- Jesus resisted the temptation of Satan to reign over an earthly kingdom (Matthew 4:8-10, John 18:36-37).

ISLAM & CHRISTIANTY: Contrasting Worldviews

- The "story" of Christianity makes an explicit distinction between the temporal and the spiritual; the "story" of Islam is one of an all-encompassing system of religious, political, and military power.
- It is true that Muslims may be "peaceful" when a minority in a strong democratic nation. When they hold the reins of temporal power in an Islamic state, however, it is often a different reality for non-Muslims.

Why Muslims Say They Do Not Advocate Terrorism

"God does not forbid you from showing kindness and dealing justly with those who have not fought you about religion and have not driven you out of your homes. God loves just dealers." (Quran, 60:8)

Why Muslims Say They Do Not Advocate Terrorism

The Prophet Muhammad used to prohibit soldiers from killing women and children, and he would advise them: {...Do not betray, do not be excessive, do not kill a newborn child.} And he also said: {Whoever has killed a person having a treaty with the Muslims shall not smell the fragrance of Paradise, though its fragrance is found for a span of forty years.}


What Western Muslims Do NOT Say

- "When you meet the unbelievers in the battlefield strike off their heads and, when you have laid them low, bind your captives firmly. Then grant them their freedom or take ransom from them, until war shall lay down her burdens" (Qur'an 47:4)
- "There is no nation but We shall destroy or sternly punish before the Day of Resurrection. This is decreed in the Eternal Book" (Qur'an 17:58)

What Western Muslims Do NOT Say







What is Islam?

Islam
 ("submission") is
 the religion of all
 who believe that
 Muhammad was
 God's prophet.



Theology

- Monotheism
- Shirk (Idolatry)
 No other God's
- Allah was the supreme god of polytheism in that area.
- In Arabia the sun god was viewed as female, the moon as male. The moon god was referred to as Allah


Anthropology

- Adam was the first man, created in heaven and removed after he sinned
- Mankind was created innocent but chose to sin
 - Mankind is misled but not fallen
 - We are intrinsically weak, frail, and imperfect.
 We are forgetful of God.

Qur' an

- Dependence on the Jewish Talmud, Jewish apocrypha, Christian apocrypha, and Zoroastrian doctrines
- Borrows important practices from pre-Islamic and pagan Arabia such as those surrounding the visits to the hills of Safa and Marwas in the hajj ceremony, and also the throwing of stones against a stone pillar symbolizing Satan


Salvation

- Consists of both belief (iman) and action (amal).
- Belief consists of:
 - Believe in the oneness of God
 - Believe in the prophecy of Muhammad
 - Believe in angels
 - Accept the Qur'an
 - Believe in life after death
 - Believe that God decrees everything



Salvation

- Good works consist of the five/six pillars:
 - Reciting the confession (shahada)
 - Prayer
 - Fasting
 - Almsgiving
 - Pilgrimage to Mecca
 - Jihad



Final Things

- This life is a preparation for the next
- Every person will taste death
- Two angels will question the dead in the grave (Munkar and Nakir)
- Unbelievers will be tormented in the grave and after the final resurrection
- The "Final Hour" will be preceded by disintegration of nature and universal sin

Jesus Christ

- Jesus is human
- Is a unique prophet, mentioned in 93 verses and 15 suras of the Qur'an
- Is called the Messiah, the Word of God, and the Spirit of God
- He is a prophet to the Jews
- Foretold the coming of Muhammad (Jn 14:26)

Jesus Christ

- Is not God or the Son of God
 - "It is not befitting To (the majesty of) God
 That He should beget a son..." (19:35)
 - "They say, 'God hath begotten A son'...No warrant Have ye for this! (10:68)
 - "Say not 'Trinity': desist: it will be better for you: for Allah is One God: glory be to Him: (far Exalted is He) above having a son.
 (4:171)



The Current Crisis

Jihad

- The word means 'striving' or 'struggle'
- Often used in the sense of personal striving in the path of God.
- According to Islamic law there are two domains
 - Dar al-Islam, the house of Islam
 - Dar al-Harb, the house of War

Jihad

"The more common interpretation, and that of the overwhelming majority of the classical jurists and commentators, presents jihad as armed struggle for Islam against infidels and apostates." (Bernard Lewis, professor of Near Eastern Studies, Princeton **University**)

Jihad and Non-Muslims

- (9:5) "Fight and slay the pagans wherever you find them, and seize them, beleager them, and lie in wait for them in every stratagem."
- (9:29) "Fight those who believe not in Allah nor the Last Day, nor hold that forbidden which hath been forbidden by Allah and His Prophet, nor acknowledge the religion of Truth, (even if they are) of the People of the Book, until they pay the jizyah with willing submission, and feel themselves subdued."

Jihad and Non-Muslims

(47:4-7) "When you meet unbelievers, smite their necks, then, when you have made wide slaughter among them, tie fast the bonds; then set them free, either by grace or ransom, till the war lays down its loads...And those who are slain in the way of God, He will not send their works astray. He will guide them, and dispose their minds aright, and He will admit them to Paradise, that He has made known to them."

- Born in 1957, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia
- Father became a billionaire during the oil boom of the 1970's (construction)
- Degree in economics and business
- Has four wives and 15 children

In 1996 bin Laden issued a fatwa, a formal religious decision calling on Muslims to kill American troops in Saudi Arabia.



- 1998 Fatwah
 - "...to kill Americans and their allies—civilians and military—is an individual duty for every Muslim who can do it in any country in which it is possible..."
 - "...to liberate the al-Aqsa
 Mosque" and to remove their armies from the lands of Islam.



- Three complaints
 - Americans in the holy land
 - Oppression of Iraq
 - Americansupport of Israel



Taliban

- "Students of Religion"
- Mullah Mohammed Omar
- Seized the capital, Kabul in 1996 and established an Islamic emirate.
- Bin Laden's organization helps to keep them in power.



Wahhabi Reforms

- Muhammad Ibn 'Abd al-Wahhab, 18th century Arabia
- Purification of Islam
- Encouragement of original thinking
- Focus on the here and now
- Militant methods

Interesting Facts

- A poll of England's Muslin community revealed that 98% would not fight for Britain; 48% would fight for Osama or Islam.
- Over 30% of Muslims in Kuwait believe that Osama is a freedom fighter.
- Former Sudanese President Sadiq el-Mahdi has prophesied that Islam will dominate the world by 2010.
- 28 of the current 30 conflicts in the world include Muslims.
